PS4. Challenges and propositions for the future

Mrs. Patricia BLANC, chief executive officer at the prevention and management of risk direction - MEDDE/DGPR

The General Directorate of Risk Prevention develops policies relative to the prevention of natural, health and technological risks. This subject covers various issues as: the industrial pollution; the damage on the environment (noise); the natural and made-man risks; the soil quality; the waste management (prevention, recovery and processing) or the industrial safety. Limiting the impacts of the natural risks and reduce the heath and technological risks is a priority.

Mr. Eric BRAC de la PERRIERE, chief executive officer - Eco-Emballages

Eco-Emballages is a private company accredited by the French public authorities to install, organise and optimise sorting and selective collection of household packaging. Eco-Emballages provides financial and technical support to the local authorities which undertake the selective collection and valorisation of household packaging waste. Eco-Emballages also provides a guaranteed recovery for all the secondary materials conform to the contractual quality standards.

Mr. Jean-Jacques COTTEL, Pas de Calais deputy, member of environment commission - National Assembly

The canton of Bapaume is included in the first constituency of Pas de Calais area. In June 2008, the Agenda 21 (which emerged from the Earth Summit in 1992) has been adopted by the regional Council of the department. It includes 62 actions for the promotion of sustainable development.



Mrs. Charlotte NITHART, director - Robin des bois

Robin des Bois is a non governmental organisation for protection of Man and the Environment, since 1985. The founders of the NGO had the ambition to be a force of proposition, not only protestation. During its first two decades of existence, Robin des Bois has worked for the protection of forests, for better waste management, for recycling in satisfactory social and environmental conditions, for the remediation of soils, for the improvement of working conditions on ships and in factories, for the preservation of water resources, against marine pollution, and against ivory smuggling.



Mr. Roger LE GOFF, co-chairman of the working group «Waste treatment and recovery» - AMF The Association of French Mayors, created in 1907, gathers 34 486 mayors. The mission of the AMF is to promote the local authorities interests. Real source of proposals, AMF maintains a constant dialogue with public administrations.



Mr. Michel VALACHE, president - FNADE

Created in 1937, FNADE (French Federation of Waste Management Services) is a professional organisation representing depollution and environment activities. It is composed of 9 trade unions, and gathers companies providing services in the following activities: management of domestic and industrial waste, conception, realisation and exploitation of waste sites, treatment units and biological and energy recovering, soil depollution, urban structures cleaning, etc. The FNADE is a member of the European Federation of Waste Management and Environmental Services (FEAD).
